Knowing your level of threat, will help you and your family make decisions in your Bush Fire Survival Plan.

- Do you plan to stay and defend?
- Do you plan to leave early?
- Do you know where you would go?
- Do you have a backup plan?
- Do you know when you would act?



Bush Fire Preparation Map



Bush Fire Management Committees identify and implement strategies to protect communities from the impact of bush fires.



What is being done around your community?
 What are you doing around your home?

- A Community Protection Plan identifies works that are to be undertaken by landowners/managers.
- Works are implemented to reduce the overall bush fire risk to a community.

Your survival during a bush fire may depend on your preparedness. A Community Protection Plan will increase the information available to you to help you make the decisions that suit you and your family.

Operational Brigade Map



Community Protection Plans collect valuable information about the community. This information is used by fire fighters to plan, prepare for and combat bush fires



Information is critical to making decisions.

- At risk community assets are identified.
- At risk residents are identified.
- At risk facilities are identified.
- This Information displayed on a map that fire fighters can use to make more informed choices.

If you already have a Bush Fire Survival Plan, Community Protection Plans contain information that will enhance your decision making. A prepared community has a higher chance of surviving a bush fire.
